

Kroenke Sports Charities provides ongoing funding and in-kind support for several local non-profit agencies that offer sports and education programs for people of all abilities.


DENVER PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOUNDATION DENVER PREP LEAGUE

In 1997, KSC became a founding partner of the Denver Prep League (DPL) to give Denver Public Schools' middle school students an avenue for participation in organized after-school activities, a void left unfilled in DPS for 30 years. Today, DPL comprises 33 schools, which enables over 5,600 students to participate in 17 sports throughout the school year and summer. School-based physical activity programs, such as Prep League, provide opportunities to help youth learn and practice social behaviors associated with teamwork, cooperation, and respect for others, which can favorably influence school climate, connectedness with school, and educational outcomes. Prep League encourages students to earn good grades, keep physically active, and learn about competition and sportsmanship while providing a safe and supervised environment.

GOLD CROWN FOUNDATION

Founded in 1986, the Gold Crown Foundation (GCF) strives to educate youth through sports and enrichment programs. With programs reaching 32,000 youth annually, GCF is built on three principles – participation, sportsmanship, and community. The Gold Crown Enrichment Program offers a variety of programs throughout the year. The Clubhouse at Edgewater provides free after-school programs for youth ages 12-18, focusing on interestbased learning. At the Clubhouse, GCF teaches technology through exploration, creativity, and self-expression.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS COLORADO UNIFIED CHAMPION SCHOOLS

Special Olympics Colorado Unified Champion Schools (UCS) is a strategy for creating cohesion between youth with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities. The strategy includes four programmatic parts: Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership, Whole School Engagement, and Inclusive Health (called the Healthy LEAP program in schools). UCS creates a channel for Special Olympics Colorado (SOCO) and schools to cooperatively work together to ensure inclusion in all school activities, equip young people with tools and training to create sport, classroom, and community experiences that reduce bullying and exclusion, promote healthy activity and interactions, combat stereotypes and stigma, eliminate hurtful language in schools, and engage young people in pro-social activities that lead to more inclusive and accepting attitudes, behaviors, and school climates. Funding from Kroenke Sports Charities provides opportunities for 32,611 students.



"Unified Champion Schools gets the buddies (partners) out of their judgment zone and assumptions, and that's where you really look at the power of unified sports. A buddy will view people with disabilities differently for the rest of their lives. They'll raise their children to view people with disabilities differently, and that's how you change the culture. That's how you build an inclusive community. We know what the research says about kids who feel connected to their schools and have a sense of belonging, and how that impacts mental health and graduation rates. UCS creates that belonging for so many students."

COLORADO AVALANCHE CHARITY GOLF CLASSIC



COLORADO AVALANCHE CHARITY BRUNCH

The 2024 Colorado Avalanche Charity Brunch, presented by Cigna, and hosted by the Avs Better Halves, was held on February 25, 2024, at the Hyatt Regency Denver Tech Center. This sold-out special event included a silent auction, brunch, and a fashion show featuring Avalanche players escorting 19 children who have overcome medical challenges.

"Ever since our daughter got sick and was hospitalized, she lost a huge part of the spark she always had. After we got the all-clear from her doctor, she refused to return to dance. She stopped dancing at home; she stopped going to all after-school activities. We knew she was silently suffering, and we tried everything we could to help her get out of the depression funk she was in. We had not seen her get out of this funk until the Avalanche Charity Brunch. On the day of the Brunch, we saw that smile from ear to ear that she always shined with return; it brought back a piece of her life that she had been missing ever since she got sick. We see such a dramatic change. The Brunch gave her the confidence she needed back. It is incredible how participating in this event can have such a powerful impact on these little kids' lives."



NUGGETS AMBASSADORS

Denver Nuggets Community Ambassadors interact with more than 15,000 people each year. Appearances include basketball skills clinics, school assemblies, and home visits. In 2023-24, the Nuggets Community Ambassadors included Walter Davis, Nicholas Owens, Mark Randall, and Kyle Speller.



WALTER DAVIS

Walter Davis (right), a 2024 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee, spent 15 years in the National Basketball Association. As a standout college player at the University of North Carolina (UNC), he was selected to play on the USA men's basketball team, coached by UNC's Dean Smith, that won the gold medal at the 1976 Summer Olympics. He won the 1978 NBA Rookie of the Year Award and earned second-team All-NBA honors. Over his first 10 seasons, Davis averaged over 20 points per game six times and earned trips to six NBA All-Star Games. Davis served as a Nuggets Community Ambassador for more than 10 years until his passing in November 2023. Walter was a great man who left a lasting impression on the organization, the communities he served, and everyone with whom he interacted. Walter's presence was a gift to the world, and he will be greatly missed.

NICHOLAS OWENS

Nicholas Owens is an inspiration to all who meet him. His relationship with the Denver Nuggets dates back to 1990 when he became involved with the team through his role as a young ambassador for Children's Hospital Colorado. In 1998, he was officially hired as a locker room attendant to care for the players and coaches. Nicholas was born with spina bifida, a congenital disability resulting in damage to the nerves in the spinal cord, leading to paralysis and sensory loss. During his lifetime, he has overcome more than 40 surgeries due to various complications. Nicholas has a love for sports and for helping others; his role as a Community Ambassador perfectly melds these two passions.



KYLE SPELLER

Nuggets in-arena announcer Kyle Speller combines his passion for the Nuggets and community through his role as a Community Ambassador. The 2023-24 season was Kyle's 19th season as the Nuggets public address announcer. He is the first African-American public address announcer in the Nuggets franchise history, and in the State of Colorado for any of the major professional sports teams.



MARK RANDALL

Former Nuggets player, assistant coach, scout, broadcaster, and in-arena host Mark Randall currently serves as a Community Ambassador for the team. In this role, Randall works with children to promote sportsmanship, teamwork, and basketball. Randall also serves as Manager of High School Athletics for Denver Public Schools, where he helps oversee the day-to-day logistics of 26 sports for 13 City of Denver High Schools.












TEAMFIT

In partnership with Kroenke Sports Charities and presented by Great Clips, the TeamFIT program supported and educated more than 300 students in grades 3 through 8 from local metro area schools. 
NHL FUTURE GOALS hockey scholar

In partnership with the National Hockey League Players' Association, and powered by Everfi, Future Goals / Hockey Scholar is an education-based program designed to help students build Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math skills using hockey as a learning vehicle. During the 2023-24 season, more than 4,000 students from Colorado, Utah, Nebraska, Kansas, Wyoming, and Montana completed the Future Goals Hockey Scholar curriculum.



STEM ON ICE

The Colorado Avalanche hosted 100 middle-school students at Ball Arena on January 25, 2024, for STEM on Ice, presented by Kiewit. Students participated in STEM stations led by various Avalanche staff members, including STEM trivia led by Avalanche captain Gabriel Landeskog.





MOST VALUABLE TEACHER

The Nuggets and Avalanche proudly honor Colorado teachers and school administrators through the Most Valuable Teacher (MVT) program, presented by Ford. During the 2023-24 seasons, the Nuggets and Avalanche honored 12 educators with the MVT award. Each educator received a celebratory classroom visit with team celebrities, tickets to a game, dinner at Ball Arena, a \$1,000 grant for classroom supplies or projects, and more. NBA MATH HOOPS

NBA Math Hoops leverages the game of basketball and the NBA/WNBA brands to build fundamental math and social-emotional skills through a physical and digital basketball-themed board game, a curriculum, and a community program experience. This free program, designed for grades 4-8, develops students' algebra readiness before high school while strengthening important skills, including selfregulation and executive function. The NBA Math Hoops program is implemented in in-school, outof-school, and home learning environments. This program experience is managed by Learn Fresh Education, a 501(c)(3) non-profit, in association with Kroenke Sports Charities and NBA Cares.

During the 2023-24 NBA season, 59 educators and 2,981 students across Colorado participated in the Nuggets NBA Math Hoops program. On April 3, 2024, the Denver Nuggets hosted the annual Nuggets Math Hoops Regional Tournament at Ball Arena, where 15 teams (30 students) competed. Harper Nein (6th-grade student) and Mindy Green (teacher/Math Hoops Educator) of Revere School (Ovid, Colorado) were selected to represent the Nuggets at the NBA Math Hoops Global Championships in New York City, which took place June 26 - 29, 2024.






Kroenke Sports Charities executes a variety of programs and community initiatives to fulfill our mission statement.

COMMUNITY PRIDE TICKET PROGRAM

The Community Pride Ticket Program provides tickets to Colorado non-profit organizations and not-for-profit schools that serve children, public servants, and community and civic groups who might not otherwise have a chance to attend a professional sporting event. During the 2023-24 seasons, Kroenke Sports Charities donated more than 20,000 tickets to local non-profit organizations and public schools.

AUTOGRAPHED MERCHANDISE DONATION PROGRAM

Colorado non-profit organizations and schools can apply online to receive autographed merchandise from a KSE team to support their organization's fundraising efforts. During the 2023-24 seasons, more than 1,000 non-profits and schools in Colorado received autographed memorabilia to assist their fundraising efforts.

KSC DAY OF SERVICE

Kroenke Sports & Entertainment encourages all employees to give back to the community by providing volunteer opportunities in the Denver community. Days of Service by KSE employees provide more than 2,000 hours of volunteer service to numerous non-profit organizations throughout the metro area. Additionally, during the 2023-24 seasons, KSE staff regularly delivered food to homebound seniors via Meals on Wheels. On September 11, 2023, Kroenke Sports Charities partnered with 9/11 Day to participate in a meal-packing volunteer event in remembrance of 9/11. As a result, over 300,000 nonperishable meals were packed and distributed to food banks throughout Colorado by Feeding Colorado.





HAT TRICK DONATIONS

Kroenke Sports Charities continued the tradition of donating hats following hat tricks by Avalanche players at Ball Arena. During the 2023-24 season, KSC donated more than 7,000 hats to Denver Rescue Mission to support the unhoused community.

DENVER POLICE FOUNDATION BACKPACK DISTRIBUTION

On August 12, 2023, Kroenke Sports Charities once again teamed up with the Denver Police Foundation to support their Back-to-School backpack distribution caravan. Team staff, mascots, and alumni ambassadors from the Nuggets, Avalanche, Mammoth, and Rapids partnered with local police officers to give out 3,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to Denver students in need.

READ ACROSS AMERICA

Each March, Read Across America week is held in honor of Dr. Seuss's birthday, encouraging children to embrace a love of reading at an early age. From March 2 – 6, 2024, representatives of the Denver Nuggets, Colorado Avalanche, Colorado Mammoth, and Altitude Sports & Entertainment visited schools throughout the metro area to read Dr. Seuss's books aloud to young students.

GOALS & DREAMS DONATION


YOUTH ON RECORD

Holiday and Nnaji toured the facility and participated in a musical jam session on the drums and keyboard with students.



FREEDOM SERVICE DOGS

As part of Avalanche Defenseman Devon Toews's nomination for the 2023 NHL King Clancy Memorial Trophy, the Avalanche teamed up with Alltroo to raise money for Freedom Service Dogs (FSD), a local organization that partners people with custom-trained assistance dogs. 




NUGGETS SPECIAL OLYMPICS BASKETBALL CLINIC




